Solid H1 results – ready to take on new opportunities

FinLab reported solid H1'20 results yesterday. **NAV increased by 10% since year-end '19 from € 27.12 per share to € 29.70 per share.** This should have been mainly driven by the strong share price development of Heliad (45% stake), which rose from € 4.28 at year end '19 to € 6.65 as of June'20, i.e. +55%.

Consequently, the revaluation gain for investments increased significantly putting the **H1 overall result, i.e. net profit adjusted for revaluation gains and losses, at a strong € 13.7m vs. H1'19 € -0.6m.**

While many companies struggle due to CoV, **FinLab's portfolio is seen to be rather positively affected** as the overriding trends such as digitization, which benefit fintech business models, are seen to even accelerate. The immediate winners in the portfolio should be:

Nextmarkets (6% of NAV): The mobile trading platform offers curated trading features and is facing a significant increase in trades and customers, according to management.

Kapilendo (5% of NAV): As a provider of financing solutions, i.e. credit brokerage for small and medium sized businesses, Kapilendo is expected to see an increase in demand especially for promotional loans to help companies bolster their liquidity buffer.

Online broker **flatex, is also benefitting dramatically from the increase in trading activity** driven by the high volatility on capital markets. **Heliad took this opportunity to divest part of its stake at € 43 per share, thereby generating a gain of € 18m (eH&A).**

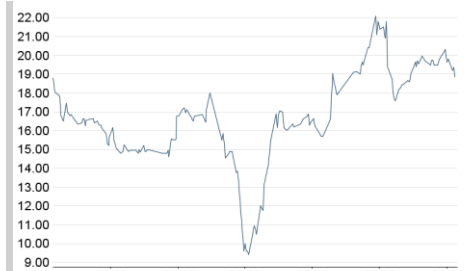
As FinLab holds a 100% stake in Heliad Managemet GmbH, which collects a 20% performance fee on Heliad's profits, it is seen to receive a **cash-in of c. € 2.5m (eH&A) in April 2021.** Considering this sizeable gain, Heliad could also pay a special dividend to shareholders, which might lead to an additional inflow for FinLab. Given the above prospects as well as the € 5.6m of cash on the B/S as of June 30, **FinLab should have enough firepower for new investments.**

Action: NAV estimates for Authada and Heliad are updated on the base of latest financing rounds/reportings. New 2021E estimates reflect the flatex deal.

In sum, FinLab looks **well positioned to continue executing on its buy-and-build strategy in the fintech space.** Trading on a 30% discount to our **new PT of € 27** (old: € 24) we reiterate our **Buy** recommendation.

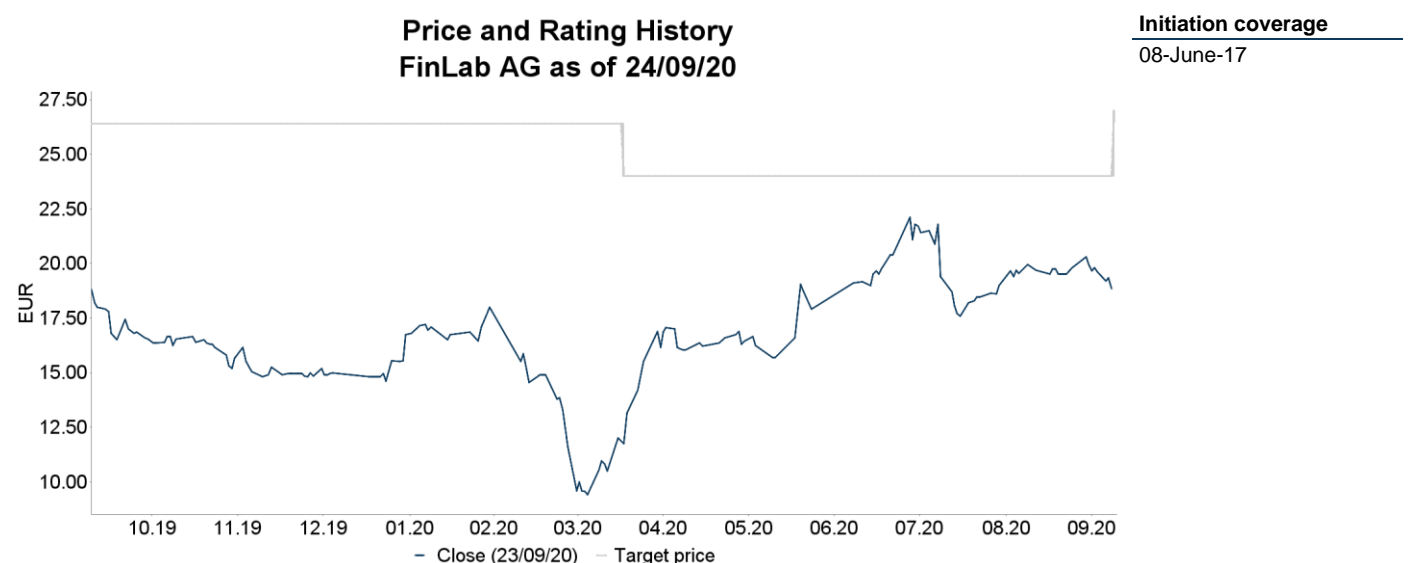

The determination of the fair value per share, i.e. the price target, and the resultant rating is done on the basis of the adjusted free cash flow (adj. FCF) method and on the basis of the discounted cash flow – DCF model. Furthermore, a peer group comparison is made.

The adj. FCF method is based on the assumption that investors purchase assets only at a price (enterprise value) at which the operating cash flow return after taxes on this investment exceeds their opportunity costs in the form of a hurdle rate of 7.5%. The operating cash flow is calculated as EBITDA less maintenance capex and taxes.

Within the framework of the DCF approach, the future free cash flows are calculated initially on the basis of a fictitious capital structure of 100% equity, i.e. interest and repayments on debt capital are not factored in initially. The adjustment towards the actual capital structure is done by discounting the calculated free cash flows with the weighted average cost of capital (WACC), which takes into account both the cost of equity capital and the cost of debt. After discounting, the calculated total enterprise value is reduced by the interest-bearing debt capital in order to arrive at the equity value.

Hauck & Aufhäuser Privatbankiers AG uses the following three-step rating system for the analysed companies:

Buy: Sustainable upside potential of more than 10% within 12 months
Sell: Sustainable downside potential of more than 10% within 12 months.
